This series will continue through to the run of our second show, *Lucky Stiff*, where we will celebrate the work of Stephen Flaherty and Lynn Ahrens. If you have not yet done so, I urge you to get tickets for these events. You will see a 'starry' cast of some of the best singers in the city. And, of course, the material will speak for itself.

Finally, I need to mention our signature Lagniappe series – curated events following each performance (except for opening and closing). These post-show events are informative and fun, and promise to round out our productions for you. They have already found quite a loyal following among our J2 Spotlight regulars.

The purpose of *Do Re Mi*, as was typical with most of the musicals of the period, was just to provide audiences with a good time. Simply that... and sharing music that just might stay with audiences for the rest of their lives.

So - have a good time. I think Do Re Mi will see to that.
